She was very generous and helpful to all who came into the store giving advice, and at times, letting her customers have the items they needed even if they did not have all the money. She also made and sold soursop and milk specials to everyone including the school children. And as the children visited the store they began to call her "The Special Lady". This was a tribute she enjoyed until she became ill, and was unable to continue.

Alen had a love for travel and was most happy as she joined her friends on many cruises arranged for Senior Citizens. She was very religious, and had a very strong belief and tie with God and instilled this feeling to her children daily. Having this faith in God, carried her through many difficult times and during her long illness.

Alen being a loving parent, took on the task of raising two (2) of her granddaughters, Rosie and Corinne (2 1/2 years and 4 months respectively), after their mother's death, and regarded them as her own.

Alen, a very respected member of the community, was the oldest resident of Frenchtown, and was selected and honored on several occasions for her contributions and dedicated service.

Ms. Alen, who lived and enjoyed a happy life of 93 years, will no longer be with us but everyone who knew her, will remember her beautiful smile.
