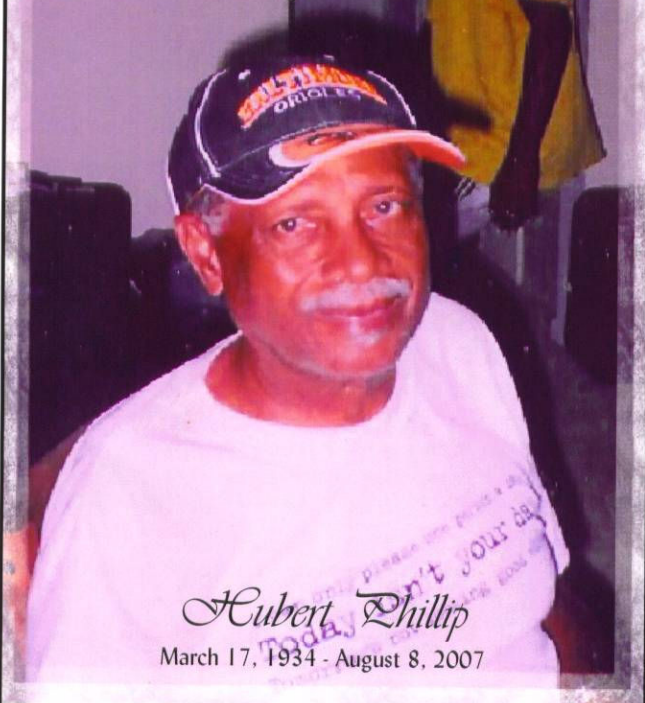

Eulogy

Hubert Alexander Phillip was born in Anguilla on March 17, 1934 to the parents of Fredrick and Olive Phillip both of Anguilla. He was the third of three (3) children, his sisters are Melanie Phillip-Hodge of Anguilla, and Jasmine Bridget Phillip-Fleming-Daly of St. Thomas.

At the age of 6, Hubert moved to St. Kitts with his aunt. He obtained his education there in St. Kitts, and when he was 15 years old he returned to Anguilla. He then went to work with the government of Anguilla as a carpenter. He worked there for about three years after which he migrated to the island of St. Croix. He also worked as a carpenter in St. Croix for about six months, and he later moved to St. Thomas.

Here on St. Thomas, Hubert worked at various locations including the former VI Hotel, The College of the Virgin Islands, and Bluebeard's Apartments. While in St. Thomas, Hubert met his beloved wife, Florence Ann Berry (deceased). Hubert and Florence were married on October 28, 1957, and have eight children as a result of that union-- six sons and two daughters. He also has another daughter from a previous relationship.

Hubert later became a contractor and built many houses here on the island of St. Thomas. After getting married, Hubert lived in Frenchtown with his family until they moved to their new home in Estate Nadir in 1961. He later built a new home in Estate Dorothea where they lived until their untimely passing.

Hubert has been an exceptional person. He was the best husband, father and friend. He made sure his family was well taken care of, and that they didn't want for anything. He provided his children with the loving and nurturing environment that has enabled them to become the men and women that they are today. He loved his grandchildren dearly

and they loved him so much. He always looked forward to having his children and grandchildren visit him. He was always a kind, loving and caring person who always went out of his way to help others. He was also a loving son and brother to his mother and sisters.

Hubert's hobbies were spearfishing, diving, catching sprats, playing pool and socializing in bars. He enjoyed taking his family on outings to Bordeaux, where they caught fish and roasted them on the beach. He also enjoyed taking them on long countryside drives. He enjoyed hanging out with his best friend, David "Obe" Hodge and other friends, and also enjoyed playing dominoes and cards with family and friends.

After the children moved away from home, Hubert and Florence were inseparable. They were often seen on the highways and byways in their blue and white Chevy S-10. They enjoyed being with each other and doing things together. Visiting Frenchtown was a daily chore. He was asked why he liked going to Frenchtown so much, and his reply was, "That is where I met my wife." Unfortunately on December 8, 2003, his beloved wife passed away. Hubert hasn't been the same since then.
