EULOGY

Jean Andre Greaux wanted everyone to call him Andre because of his deceased brother, John, and the fact that Jean in French when pronounced sounds almost the same.

Andre was born on November 18, 1924 in St. Thomas, Virgin Islands to Octave and Marie Josephine Greaux, who migrated from St. Barth's. Born blind, Andre did not receive a normal formal education. However, he did travel to Philadelphia and New York to receive training for the blind. Through this training he was able to take care of himself, assist around the family home and attend Mass at St. Anne's Chapel without assistance.

In his later years, he became ill and lost the use of his legs and was unable to attend Mass. However, he would attend Mass through the Catholic Television network, Channel 16. He enjoyed listening to Mother Angelica and many of the other teachings on the Catholic Television Network.

Andre also loved listening to music and the old time stories on the local radio station.

He was a very quiet person and died as he lived--peaceful.
