Eulogy

Joseph Ledee, known as Sukie, was born on the island of St. Thomas on November 21, 1937, the son of Marie Josephine and Phillip Ledee. He departed this life on April 3, 1984 at the age of 46.

Sukie was popularly known throughout the Virgin Islands and other neighboring islands as a disc jockey on Radio Station WSTA in the early 50's. His program "Sukie's Western Jamboree" became the most popular in radio and made him the No. 1 disc jockey.

He attended Sts. Peter and Paul School and was a graduate of the Class of 1956. He was employed at the Department of Commerce for twenty (20) years. He served his last seven years at the Department of Property and Procurement within the Accounting Division. His tenure with the Government of the Virgin Islands was twenty-seven (27) years.

Joseph was a very quiet, reserved, pleasant, friendly, loving and easy individual to get along with. You had to really know him – he was a true Scorpio – always willing to do what ever was asked of him. As he lived, so he departed. He will never be forgotten.
