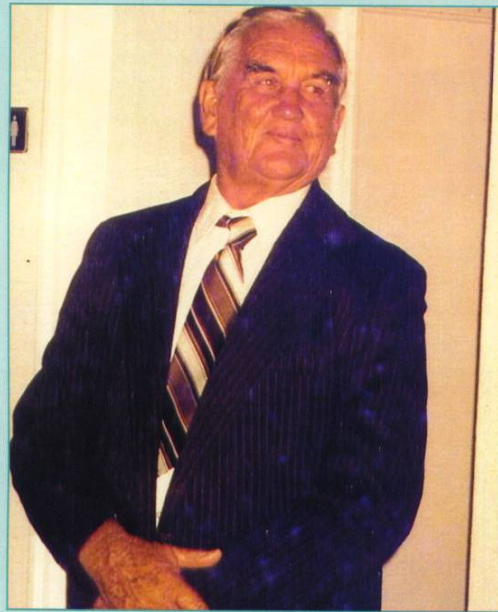

On October 29, 1929, Louis Philip Querrard was born in St. Thomas to Louis Emanuel and Ernestine Querrard, their first of six children. Philip attended Robert Herrick School, currently known as Joseph Sibilly School, as well as Madison School.

On October 3, 1952, he was inducted into the United States Army, and stationed in Germany as infantryman until September 17, 1953, when he was honorably discharged from the military.

Upon returning home, he met and married Evadnie Berry. That union produced two children; Patricia Rose Querrard LeGoff and Patrick Philip Querrard. He also has two grandchildren; Rhea Ledee and Zackarie LeGoff.

In the early years Philip worked in the construction field until he obtained the opportunity to learn a trade in plumbing. He became a plumbing contractor and for the past 27 years worked exclusively for the West Indian Company.

On January 3, 2006, he suffered a massive stroke and became bedridden. On November 8, 2007, as a result of his ailing condition he passed away.

Louis Philip Querrard was a man with a very big heart, who loved to laugh, joke, plant fruit trees, play his accordion, and listen to hymns and country western music. He enjoyed the time he spent with his grandchildren; Rhea and Zackerie, and "pappy's grandchildren"; the name he gave the many children he considered as his own sons and daughters.

Although bedridden, he never lost his sense of humor and spirit. He loved to talk and laugh with all of his welcomed visitors, as he was just five minutes before he left this earth to meet his maker.
