Today we are gathered here to pay tribute, mourn and say our final farewell – each in our own way – to Margaret Turbé, loving wife, mother, grandmother and friend. It was only ten months ago that we were gathered here to mourn the passing of her husband, Felix Turbé.

We all share a deep sorrow and profound sense of loss for her. Her most important role was total dedication to her family. The rest of her time was devoted to helping others through church and civic activities. Among these, she served as president of St. Anne's Society, visited the elderly and ill at home, assisted in school fund raising, started and taught a sewing class for the youth of Frenchtown, promoted the craft of straw work at the V.I. Cooperative and was also pictured in the September, 1940 issue of *National Geographic Magazine*, promoting straw products and their importance to the tourist trade.

She was truly an ambassador of good will who found time to advise and counsel both friends and visitors. She welcomed opportunities and was always willing to try new ideas and share them with her family. She was a kind, loving and caring woman and greeted all with a warm smile.

Margaret was 73 years old. She was born on St. Thomas and spent her entire life with her family in Frenchtown.

She was married to Felix Turbé in 1940 and together they raised four loving children – Elaine, Millie, Jean and Katy, all of whom are present today.

Margaret Turbé had been residing in Alabama for the last two years with her daughter, Millie and her family. She had required special care and was under medical supervision. She was cared for with a most special love by her children until her departure. They will miss her dearly. The family is deeply honored by your presence here today. They thank you for sharing their sorrow and respect for their Mom. Margaret, we will miss – and remember – you.
