Romea always insisted on having the last word - whether she was right or wrong. About an hour before she passed away she sat up in her bed and spoke individually to each of us in the room. Become all that you can be. Life will not always be easy but remember when things are most difficult, your guardian angel, Mama, will be right there with you. Study about this disease because it is in your family tree. Eat fruits and vegetables and fish and the things that are good for you, not candy. Make Papa take you to the doctor every year for a check up...Don't be like Mama and feel that it can't touch you until it is too late. Continue to study hard and continue to bring home A's like you do now. That is the biggest gift you can continue to give me. Remember, the one thing that no one can ever take from you is your education. It has always been my dream for you, that you get enough education to let you choose the career that will bring you happiness.
